**Raised track** - 1000ft of 3.5, 5" and 7.25" aluminium rail in a Dog Bone shape, 2 two aspect (Red & Green) signals. Curves are 50 ft radius and have transition into and out of all curves.

**Ground level track** - 1000ft of 5" & 7.25" aluminium rail runs around the outside of the raised track and incorporates a covered station, 40' tunnel and separate siding, 4 aspect signalling is used.

Areas within the track can be used for running traction and stationary engines. The Society has a marquee which is also used as a display area for members exhibits.

All steaming bays have full vehicle access and locomotive lifts with water, compressed air and a 12v electrical supply.
